### Breakfast Club and After School Clubs

From January we are very sad to say that we have to increase the cost for Breakfast and After School Club. The last time prices were raised was over 4 years ago. We have resisted this move for as long as possible in the currentfinancial climate but unfortunately we now have no choice due to the continuously rising costs school is incurring. We are really sorry we have to pass this on to you too as parents. The new costs per session will be as follows:

- Breakfast club will rise from £2.50 to £3.50
- After School Club will rise from £7.70 to £9.00 with sibling reduction rising from £5.50 to £7.00
