Our learning this week:

Look at how much our caterpillars have grown! They are munching their way through the sticky yellow food in their pot and making their way up to the lid spinning silky webs as they do so. When we looked in our information book we noticed that caterpillars like to hang down when they make a chrysalis – we think they must be getting ready.





We have learned that butterflies have beautiful patterns on their wings and that their wings are symmetrical. We had fun making symmetrical shapes with our bodies.

In the Art studio we have been exploring 2D shapes to make symmetrical patterns on our butterflies.





Bean plant update!

Our beanstalks had grown so much we needed to support the stem with a stick. Time to plant them outdoors – we hope they bring you lots of delicious runner beans.

Our magic beans grew into something quite unexpected! Yum yum yum!
