Reading

Our class novel will be 'How to train your dragon'. As well as this, we will read short story extracts and focus on explaining, summarising and inferring meaning from these. We will read examples of nonfiction texts to broaden our understanding of the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. The children will continue to have opportunities to read for pleasure.

Maths

We will continue our work on decimals looking at comparing and ordering decimals as well as rounding them. Later we will learn about money including how to calculate change and solve problems. Then we will learn about time including the 24hour clock and analogue and digital times. After half term, our focus will be investigating 2D and 3D shape. We will learn about collecting and interpreting data too. Throughout the term, we will continue to focus on learning our times table facts and practise these regularly in class.

Science

We will be recapping the digestive system, and investigating teeth and tooth decay as well as looking at food chains.

We also have our topic of animals in which we will look at what nutrients different food provides, how the human skeleton support us and how bones and muscles work together, as well as looking at animal classification.

<u>PE</u>

Our sports for the summer term will be kwik cricket, rounders and athletics. Hazel class will be going to Plainmoor swimming pool to have swimming sessions.

French

During the term, we will continue to recap and consolidate previous learning on numbers and food. Our main learning will be linked to the Eurovision song contest and French weather.

RE
