

Autumn Term Newsletter No.11 (29.11.19)

This week it has been a busy time for our school governors. On Tuesday, our Vice-Chairperson Jamie Cree joined us to explore the progress we are making with the changes to our curriculum and the quality of support we give to those pupils who qualify for the pupil premium. He met with Miss Wooldridge who is our Pupil Premium Champion and Mr Robinson who leads on our curriculum to challenge and support their work. He also enjoyed one of our lovely school lunches with myself and the children.

On Thursday evening, the Full Governing Board met to explore school data and trends. We looked at our school strengths and at the areas where we need to improve. Understanding this picture enables governors to ask the right questions to hold us to account.

As an Academy Trust we have two layers to our governors. Sitting at the top and meeting once a year we have three members: Jonathan Dickson (the Chairperson), Myles Key and Ray Hill. Sitting below them is the main board of governors (also known as trustees) who are more actively involved in school improvement across the year. Jonathan is also a governor as well as member. This main board meets four times a year. It is also divided further into different committees who meet across the year for finance & audit, pay & staffing and educational standards. Other committees can be convened on a needs basis. In addition each of our governors has a 1:1 role linked to a school improvement priority like Jamie Cree's work mentioned above.

There have recently been a few changes to the governing board. Myles and Ray moved to become members while Lisa Phillips, one of our parent governors, stepped down this term after over 6 years of service. Lisa has been proactive in providing support and challenge with her characteristic warmth. We are particularly grateful for her commitment to SEN and Safeguarding where she has worked closely with Mrs Pike to support us in these two important areas. She will be greatly missed and we would like to express our gratitude for her time and commitment to St Margaret's. Because of this we have a vacancy for a new parent governor which we will be advertising in the new year. If you are interested in this role please look out for further information in January.

On Thursday we welcomed three new governors to the board: Tom Brookman-Skirrow, Lyndsey Kane and Simon Kane, each of whom bring skills from their day jobs that will help support us. Simon works in the health and safety / building industry while Lyndsey and Tom are both in education. Tom was a pupil here himself and recognises many of the staff on our photographs.

On Monday and Tuesday we had the second round of workshops from Bullies Out. Steve, who ran the groups commented, "All of the children were amazing and are a credit to the teachers.
