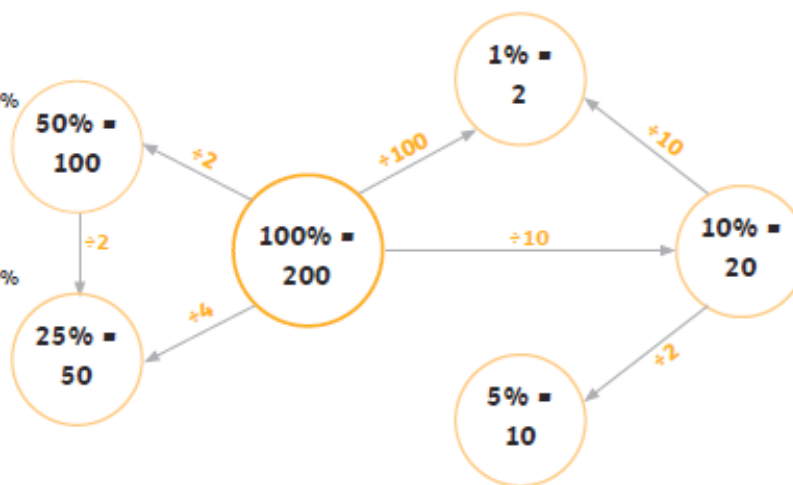
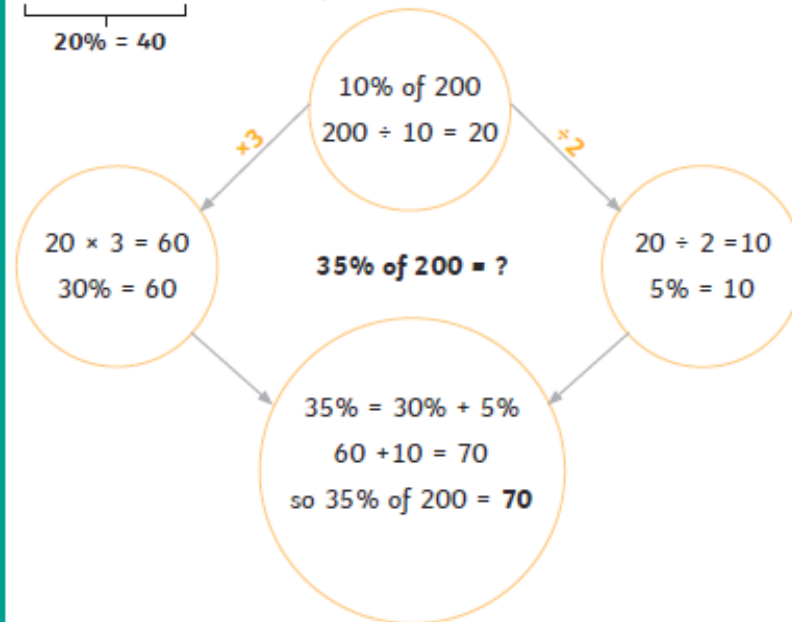
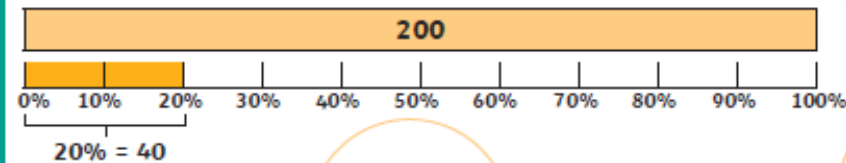
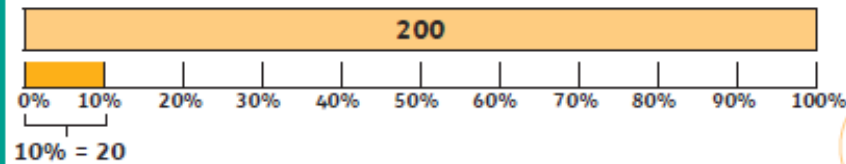
Finding a Percentage of an Amount

$50\% = \frac{1}{2}$ so we can divide by 2

$10\% = \frac{1}{10}$ so we can divide by 10

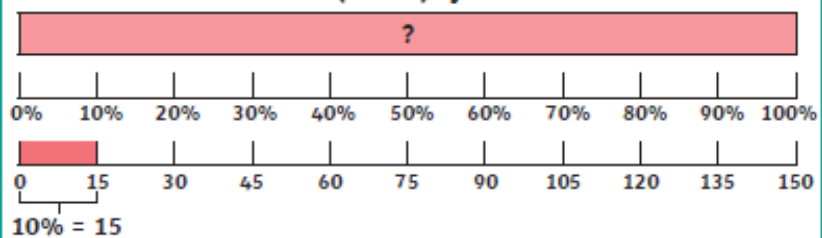
$25\% = \frac{1}{4}$ so we can divide by 4

$1\% = \frac{1}{100}$ so we can divide by 100



Percentages – Missing Values

Whole value (100%) of bar model = ?



We know 10% = 15 10% $\times$ 10 = 100% (the whole) so 15 $\times$ 10 = 150
