

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Maths</u></p> <p>We will begin by developing our understanding of place value and then move onto the written methods for addition and subtraction. In the second half of the Autumn term, we will move into written methods for multiplication and division. Times tables and related division facts will be a constant focus throughout the term.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>English</u></p> <p>We will beginning the term by writing to entertain an audience, Our stimulus will be the book 'Blue John' which will inspire story writing. We will then be moving into writing to inform an audience. For this next piece, we will write a recount of our trip to Kents Cavern. For our last piece this term we will again be writing to entertain an audience using the skills gained throughout the term. This will be a time travel setting description based on the book 'Stone Age Boy'. Reading for pleasure and the skills of reading will also be a prime focus throughout the term.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Science</u></p> <p>In our topic about rocks, we will be studying how rocks are formed, the differences between them (igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic) and where they can be found in our local area.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>History</u></p> <p>Our history unit will be investigating changes in Britain from the Stine Age to the iron Age. We will also be investigating famous landmarks such as Skara Brae and Stone Henge. We will be making a link to our local area with a year group trip to Kents Cavern.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>PE</u></p> <p>Our key outdoor sports will be tag rugby and handball, as we develop the skills of hand-eye coordination and improve our motor skills. Our indoor sports will focus on gymnastics as we develop our skills of agility and flexibility.</p>	<p><u>Year 3 Autumn Curriculum Overview</u></p> <p>In Autumn term, we will recap on key skills from Year 2 as we help the children return to school after the lockdown period. Some subjects will be taught discretely, and a lot of our learning will be connected to our history unit about the Stone Age- see the attached collectables for more details about our main themes. We will also be learning simple classroom commands and studying other countries where French is spoken. Additionally we will also learn numbers 1-6.</p>

Our Jigsaw themes are 'Being Me in My World' and 'Celebrating Difference'.
