What does a bean seed need to grow?

It has been a busy start back to school after the half-term holiday. On Monday some bean seeds arrived. We looked at a real bean pod and talked about the life-cycle of a bean plant. The children decided what they would need to plant their seed and how to take care of it so it would grow. They have chosen to keep their beans in the garden "...because it is warm and sunny and they will grow". They carefully watered their beans so as not to give them too much or too little to drink.







Mrs Heavisides set the children off on an exciting measuring adventure during the week. A giant-sized footprint appeared in the classrooms so the children got busy exploring how many of their own footprints would be 'the same'. They were then able to use a sentence stem to explain their findings e.g. "The giant's footprint is equal to 6 of my footprints." The children were inspired to find out how tall they were and used number rods as a non-standard measure, adding up the total amount as a measure.

We also made a chart, comparing the different heights of each of

the children and staff.








Learning inspired by our story theme:

At the end of the week, the children enjoyed their first assembly in the big school with Mr Hughes. They practised walking in quietly and making a smart line before sitting down. Mr Hughes was very proud of how well they did with this! They listened to the story of a resilient seed that grew and changed against the odds. He helped the children to reflect on how they have grown and changed this year and of how they are getting ready to move to Year I.




Books we shared this week






Home learning fun
