Winter Infections Circulating - reminder

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) — South West has warned of a rise in respiratory infections (colds, covid, flu) and whooping cough, scarlet fever and chickenpox up to and including the Easter break.

Increasing levels of measles are also being predicted. The UKHSA is advising to make sure you get your child vaccinated with the MMR if you haven't yet done so. It's never too late they say. More info can be found on this <u>link</u>.

If you think your child has measles, please contact your GP asap and inform school asap. If they are diagnosed, they must stay off school for a minimum of 4 days from the onset of the rash until they are well enough to return.
