School Emergency Protocols

In school we have emergency protocols in the event of a fire, adverse weather, a localised problem such as a gas leak, a bomb threat or if we have an intruder. We run a fire drill once per term so children and staff are very familiar with what to do in the event of a real fire. If there is adverse weather, a localised problem or a bomb threat we have policies in place to manage each of these without the need for a drill.

In recent times, schools have now added lockdown protocols in the event of an intruder. This week we ran a drill to test our systems in case of the highly unlikely chance of this ever happening. We absolutely do not want to terrify the children and therefore explained that this drill was in case a wild dog or crazy fox had somehow got into the school grounds – which in theory could happen and would require the same procedure i.e. to lockdown. This has a different sounding alarm. Once it sounds, children and staff hide in their classroom, lock doors, close windows, draw blinds, remain silent and endure until a senior leader announces the end of the drill. This is the main principle but staff know more details of what to do and how to act in different scenarios but we haven't shared all of this to avoid adding unnecessary angst on the children. If you are interested in knowing more details, I am very happy to share our emergency lockdown procedure with you so please just ask.
