

Did you know?

- Scientists think there are about 390,000 varieties of plant in the world!

- Observe To look carefully and notice things. Sometimes equipment can be used e.g. microscope or magnifying glass.
- Common Something which happens very often.
- Produce Something that a farmer grows or raises including fruits and vegetables..
- Blossom A type of flower that develops on trees. When the blossom falls off the fruits begin to grow.

Structure The parts of a plant or tree

Habitat The surroundings that enable something to live. Seasons How the year is divided up based on the weather patterns for that time. (Spring, Summer, Autumn, Winter).

Mature Fully developed or fully grown.

Wild plants Plants that can live without a human looking after them. Compost Provides extra nutrients for plants when they are growing.
