Hearing Support Unit

As I'm sure you're aware, our Hearing Support Centre (HSC) continues to be in the spotlight following the Local Authority's decision to close the unit. While the LA has guaranteed the funding for children with an Educational Health Care Plan, we know this is not enough because it doesn't take account of the additional 14 children who have hearing loss, who attend St Margaret's and don't come with funding.

We have had visits from ex-pupils with hearing impairments who attended St Margaret's in the late 1960s and 1970s. We've also had the LA SEND team, an LA councillor and the local MP, Steve Darling, visit to see our HSC in action. It has been great to show them how it is such an integral part of St Margaret's and our community, benefiting the full range of children with a hearing impairment who attend here as well as our hearing children who learn to sign and take part in an inclusive community.

Thank you to those of you who have signed the online Torbay petition. The current number of signatures stands at 600. If we can get it to 1000, the council will have to review the decision. The petition can be found here and can be completed by anybody who lives in Torbay. Thank you to the PTA for their support with this. On Wednesday this week, the BBC joined us as part of a feature they hope to show on Spotlight in the near future (possible Wednesday 11.12.24 at 6.30pm).

We are gaining momentum with the publicity and we hope this will help the LA fully understand what our Hearing Support Centre truly offers. The LA is in a bit of a funding crisis when it comes to Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. We do understand the challenges they are facing and we really hope we can work together with them to keep our HSC open so we can continue to provide the same offer we currently do.
