We are delighted to be able to report that the Ofsted Inspectors have judged that the school is still a Good school. We have emailed the report out to you along with this newsletter so you can read it before it is published on 12th October on Ofsted's website. The Inspectors spent the day in school, meeting Senior Leaders, observing lessons and talking to children. They could see how the school has improved since the last Inspection in 2013 and this is due to every one of our members of staff who are fully committed to making the school a fabulous place for the children and their families. The Inspectors were incredibly complimentary about the children, saying they had a fantastic attitude to their learning and commended the presentation in their books. They also commented on the children's fabulous behaviour throughout the day and said, when they spoke to them they were confident, articulate and well mannered. We are proud of them every single day but were especially proud that day as the inspectors were able to see in them what we see in them!



One of the key improvements has been how many Y6 children in our school achieve well compared to local and national data. This is the second year we have beaten national averages for children working at a higher standard in reading, writing and maths. We do not place limits on children's learning and encourage children to challenge themselves in every lesson. We are hosting our first Parent Drop in for Y1—Y6 on Thursday 19th October so you will be able to look at their books and talk to your child about their work.


Percentage of pupils achieving the expected standard ?
