#### Men's Health Week

If you are reading this section and can relate to this or know a man who might benefit, please do forward this on to them.

Surveys show that males everywhere are reluctant to talk about their mental health and are more likely to die by suicide than females. Many men find themselves grappling with prescriptive, antiquated ideas about gender — and this struggle can contribute to mental health issues and make it difficult to seek the help they need.

<u>Safer Futures</u> are hosting a series of webinars throughout Men's Health Week in June 2024. Daily webinars include behaviour change and addressing men's abusive behaviour; celebrating men's vulnerability; support for men who have experienced domestic abuse; and strategies for supporting men and boys' mental health.
