Reading Success

I'm sure you are aware that we are putting a lot of work into ensuring we provide high quality teaching in reading.

This year we are in the middle of a reading for pleasure project with the Open University, led by our change team (Mrs Turner, Mrs Tandy, Miss Pilkiewicz and the reading guinea pigs, Roald and Dahl). This is work that all children across the school are involved in and is a project that will continue in the future to embed practice. For the last two years we have been involved in project to improve early reading from Reception to Year 2 with the introduction of the *Read Write Inc* (RWI) scheme. We also use catch-up decoding programmes for our older pupils. In this we partnered with the local English Hub, the lead of which commented yesterday, "Thank for so much for an amazing day! I am so proud of how far you and your team have come since I first started working with you, and you can clearly see the amount of progress the children have made."
