Due to previous demand, **every other Saturday from 28th June until the end of August,** we will be holding our "Kids Club" sessions for children to come and have a free one-off NHS checkup appointment with our lovely dentist Parsa Mosaddad.

We would love for you to forward this information to the parents and guardians of the children at your school so they can take us up on this opportunity - at present we are only working with select local schools and spaces will be limited.

To book an appointment for their child/children they just need to call 01803 328113 or pop into our St Marychurch practice and one of our reception team will be more than happy to help!

This won't register the child with the practice but should enable them to have an NHS dental check-up and 1 course of treatment.

Please note, if any parents are unable to attend on a Saturday for various reasons, then we may have other availability if they contact the reception team.
