Bikeability — Level 2

This week it was lovely to see so many bikes parked in our bike storage and the return of Bikeability in school.



Pupils from Y5 and Y6 have been awarded the nationally recognised and certificated qualification – Bikeability Level 2. This was an 8-hour course spread over 4 days and it was quite intensive. Level two taught the children to cycle planned routes on minor roads near the school - offering real cycling experience.

The course involved 4 comprehensive sessions, where National Standards Instructors taught the children bike handling skills, developed their confidence and helped them get prepared for riding their bikes on today's roads. Congratulations to all the children who passed the course.

To book an appointment for their child/children they just need to call 01803 328113 or pop into our St Marychurch practice and one of our reception team will be more than happy to help!

This won't register the child with the practice but should enable them to have an NHS dental check-up and 1 course of treatment.

Please note, if any parents are unable to attend on a Saturday for various reasons, then we may have other availability if they contact the reception team.
