## **Autumn Festivals**

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Through stories, images and video, the children have learned all about the Hindu festival of Diwali this week. We talked about the traditions linked to this special time and we compared them to those in festivals we celebrate.

They learned that little lights called Diva's are laid out in a row along the windowsill in Hindu homes to bring good health and wealth and that Hindus also create patterns to decorate their homes called 'Rangoli.' The children have even used objects and 2d shapes to create their own patterns. You can see some of these in our Learning Gallery page below.

We have also learnt about Mendhi hand patterns and after looking at some examples we tried to copy some of the patterns and designs to create our own.

## **Our Maths Learning this week**

This week in Maths we have been working on our careful counting skills. We have practised accurately counting sets of objects using 4 key rules. We started off by watching the 'How to Count' Numberblocks video to introduce these rules to us and we then had a go at practising these skills for ourselves. There are some very careful counters in Acorns! Please see the Careful Counting Collectable attached to your email to reinforce these key skills at home. There are many opportunities in every day life to encourage your child to practise their careful counting skills, including counting the number of toys as you put them away, counting out cupcake cases as you bake, counting out shopping items etc.

#### **Read Write Inc. Phonics**





This week in school we have been practising applying our phonic skills to write short simple words such as pig, pan, leg, cat, dog. We have focussed on matching the initial sound to a picture and then we had a go at saying the word in 'Fred Talk' together before writing the letter shapes down. We practised using our 'snappy crocodile fingers to hold our pencil and used the handwriting rhymes we have been learning in phonics to write our letters with the correct formation. What super little writers the children have been this week.

At home please continue to support your child to write their name, using their name card to help them if needed. We are seeing such progress with this every day and we are very proud of all the children for working so hard.
