The children have been buzzing with excitement this week as they prepared for Easter.

Spring has sprung!

The week began with a surprise letter from a very special bunny who told the children that Spring had arrived and it would soon be time for Easter. The children had a think about all the signs of Spring they had noticed as they played outside and walked around the school grounds.

The Easter bunny (who loves eggs) asked us the question, 'Do all eggs have chocolate inside?'. Using information from pictures, books and videos the children got busy finding out which creatures hatch from eggs. They began to use language of classification as they grouped these creatures e.g. birds, fish, spiders, insects and reptiles. The children were amazed by some of the facts they learned, particularly that penguins carry their eggs on their feet!





The children noticed that real eggs often have a patterned shell. We had a cracking time creating splatter patterns for our Easter egg cards by flicking paint from a brush.... sorry for the spotty faces and jumpers!

The children learned about the animals born in spring who do not hatch from eggs. Using our small world animal figures, the children named each baby animal, pairing it with its parent.

As you sing along with your child, encourage them to represent the number of eggs in the nest with their fingers, counting down as each egg hatches. Can they tell you how many eggs are left each time a new chick hatches and explain how they know e.g. 2 chicks have hatched so there are still 2 eggs left because 2 and 2 makes 4.
