Crowning Glory









We learned that the colours red, white and blue were used on our Union Jack flag. It was exciting to come to school dressed in these colours on Friday.






A flag for the king!

The children looked at the shapes and colours on the Union Jack flag. They used this as inspiration for creating their own designs.






































A portrait of our King





What a happy way to end the week before this memorable weekend. The children had a wonderful tea party – thank you for preparing the delicious treats.






























Books we shared this week



Solve-a-saurus Isaac worked out how to ensure his crown fit his head perfectly by using the strip to measure around his head and holding it carefully in place as he taped it together.


Isaac, we think you have Made a crown fit for a King!
