It has been an especially eventful week in school with lots of excitement and buzz.

School Review

Each year, as part of the regular cycle of school improvement, we have an external review of the school. This is to ensure we continue to deliver the best quality education possible and to help us identify some next steps to take us further forward. We had this review on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday this week with a team of senior leaders from other schools, led by a lead Ofsted inspector.

It was a very positive three days. The learning behaviours and attitudes of children came out as a real strength. Reviewers were impressed with the high levels of respectful behaviour children show to others. Children spoke articulately about how happy they are to come to St Margaret's, how they enjoy their lessons and how they enjoy the extra opportunities we provide. Reviewers were especially impressed with the curriculum we provide for your children and commented on the strengths of the provision across the school, starting with excellent practice in Foundation Stage. They recognised the high level of staffing we are able to provide and how well we deploy staff to meet the needs of children. Our next steps are around how we further challenge some of the more able and how we best develop the collaboration between staff to further improve teaching. It was a very rewarding three days and as always, it reminds me that St Margaret's is a very special school.

Thank you to all the staff who, as always, go above and beyond for your children.

Remembrance Day

On Monday we marked Remembrance Day with 2 minutes of silent reflection on the playground at 11.00am. We also discussed and reflected further in the afternoon's assembly.
