#### **World Book Day**

We all enjoyed a fun day on Thursday dressed as different book characters – all good in helping raise the awareness and generate enjoyment of reading. We were also joined by local author, Clare Brown, who shared her wonderful books and inspired the children to be writers themselves with her thoughts about what it is like to be a real author. "The Wonderweeds" are an original and fun collection of poems with a powerful message; "Wonderweeds are friends we need". Bridging both fact and fiction, The Wonderweeds are ten weeds whose characters tell the story of their plant lives in a way that helps children to identify them and understand their characteristics better. The latter pages take the reader into educational material that is equally useful in the home or school. It has been written with the national curriculum in mind, but also for plant and insect lovers alike.

One area goes into the Dandelion Food web which has been written with the support of John Walters, a local entomologist who has recorded work for the BBC Wild Britain and Autumn Watch.
