The decision to strike has not been taken lightly by teachers. I know they have agonised over this and I have been deeply touched to know that their hearts have been fully empathetic over the stress this may cause you and your children, especially after so many closures during the pandemic. Those taking part in the strike have composed the following message to you, to explain their thinking:

As teachers, our biggest priority has always been and will always be your children and the families at St Margaret's. The decision we have made to strike has not been an easy one. Our decision is representative of a much larger issue, directly targeted at our government and dwindling budgets for schools. For too many years, school budgets have been constricted and this has had a direct impact on what we are able to do and achieve with the children in our care. The workload and pressure that teachers and schools are under is immense. We feel strongly that it cannot continue in this way. We apologise in advance for any inconvenience this causes you and your family but hope that you understand and will be supportive. Please do not hesitate to come and speak to us if you need support following this decision. Our utmost priority remains to be our families here at St Margaret's.
