



Year 3 and 4 Autumn 1 Curriculum 2019-2020.

A big welcome to the new school year! Together, we have created exciting learning opportunities throughout the curriculum. Our topic theme for this half term is Survival! We will begin with an exciting trip to Fort Apache where we will be learning vital survival skills including foraging, shelter building and fire making. -What an exciting opening chapter to our year 3 and 4 adventure!

In English, we will be writing instructions for how to build a shelter and creating and non-chronological reports based on the Deadly 60.

In maths, both year groups will be focusing on place value and writing methods for addition and subtraction.

In science, we will be learning about living things and their habitats including: grouping living things, classifying animals, exploring animal habitats and learning about changes to the local environment.

Expectations

To help maintain high levels of expectation, we would appreciate your cooperation with the following:

Uniform and PE Kit

- Full PE kit in school at all times that is labelled. We ask that it is in a drawstring bag (no large backpacks) Earrings cannot be worn during P.E lesson.
- Named water bottle to be brought in every day.

Behaviour and attendance
