

<p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>We will begin the term by focusing on measurements. Children will learn how to convert between different units, and solve problems involving perimeter, area and volume. Our pupils will also learn how to find areas of different shapes. Alongside this, we will also revise work from lockdown, including algebra and using formulae. Throughout the term, we will be enhancing children's arithmetic skills with a weekly challenge and continual revision of key methods. Pupils will develop their understanding of statistics, and also learn how to solve problems involving ratio.</p>	<p><u>Writing</u></p> <p>We will begin the term by looking at blogs. Children will focus on Helen Skelton's Amazon adventure and will explore her blog posts in detail. Key skills will be revised throughout the unit leading to the children planning, writing and editing a blog that will be written in the same style as Helen Skelton. Leading on from this we will be investigating a variety of short stories with surprising endings. Handwriting and spelling will be practised regularly.</p>	<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>Our Science topic for this term will be animals and humans. We will learn about the circulatory system and the functions of the heart. This will be built upon further as we study the impact of exercise and a healthy diet on the body. In addition to this, we will look at healthy lifestyles and the impact on physical health. This links into our PSHE topic of 'Healthy Me'.</p>	<p><u>Reading</u></p> <p>During our discrete whole class reading sessions we will be focusing on developing our comprehension skills of reading including explaining new vocabulary, retrieval, inference and summarising ideas. We will read the class novel 'Holes' and develop our understanding of play scripts.</p> <p><u>Music</u></p> <p>In music, children will be preparing compositions to perform in the end of year play. They will consider harmony, rhythm and dynamics, and practise singing as part of small and large groups.</p>
<p><u>PE</u></p> <p>Our key outdoor sports will be athletics. Many of these skills will be utilised in our school's sports day. We will also focus on developing key team skills in rounders. Activities Week will provide further opportunities for Team Skills.</p>	<p><u>Year 6 Summer Curriculum Overview</u></p> <p>In the Summer term, we will have a short Art unit focused on Friedensreich Hundertwasser, before focusing on some exciting experiences for the end of the year. These will include preparing an end of Year production, Activities Week, the Leavers' Assembly and preparing for our transition to Secondary School.</p>		<p><u>French</u></p> <p>This term we will be learning how to describe a monster. The unit will cover colours, body parts, feminine and masculine words and how to put this knowledge together to accurately describe a monster.</p>
<p><u>RE</u></p> <p>This term we will be looking at Christian beliefs about Creation, and considering other points of view about how the universe began.</p>	<p><u>PSHCE</u></p> <p>Our Jigsaw themes are 'Healthy Me' and changes. We will focus on healthy lifestyles, and ways to support our own wellbeing.</p>	<p><u>History</u></p> <p>As we continue to develop our Enquiry approach, we will study key questions relating to the Ancient Greeks.</p>	<p><u>Computing</u></p> <p>For computing we will be examining how to create and use variables in different software, and how this applies to programming.</p>
