Remember, Remember......

We have had a lovely week themed around bonfire night and remembrance day and the children have loved sharing their experiences and knowledge about these very special days.

Using black paper and pastels the children have enjoyed making marks that resemble bright and colourful exploding fireworks. The children have also enjoyed creating their own transient art this week – creating poppies using the correct colours out of various loose parts. Through painting their own poppies the children have developed their painting skills with a particular focus on taking extra care to ensure the colours do not merge together. The children had to ensure they washed their brushes thoroughly when changing colours and worked hard to follow the outline of their pictures with precision. At home you might like to continue the discussion around these events and there is also a lovely video on CBeebies about remembrance day that we have watched with the children this week. Here is the link:



In Maths this week

This week the children have been learning to quantify a set of objects by subitising, rather than counting. When subitising, children can say how many there are in a small group of objects by 'just seeing' and knowing straight away without the need to count. This week we have explored identifying groups of 2 and 3 in different arrangements, including using our fingers to show these amounts. Subitising is a really important skill in helping children to develop their early number sense. Below is a link to a fun game to help your child practise their subitising skills!

Subitising Challenge


Look at the picture of blueberries on a plate and can you be number hunters of 1, 2 and 3? Sometimes 1, 2 and 3 are hiding in bigger numbers. Talk about which numbers you can see. Try to encourage your child to spot the numbers without counting.

Read Write Inc

Read Write Inc. Phonics

This week your child has been working in smaller phonic groups to help them work on their next steps in their learning. For some groups it has been important to consolidate previously taught letter sounds to help them recall these letters with ease and speed. Some groups have learnt some new letter sounds and are beginning to practise blending these sounds together to read simple words. Please remember all children develop with these skills at their own pace and some just need a little longer to practise and embed their new learning. You will find the links for your child's phonics learning this week attached to the same email as this newsletter. Please remember if your child is revising previously taught sounds we will not have included any new sound cards in their book bag so please continue to practise the ones you already have. You may wish to reduce the number of sounds in their pack if there are quite a few that your child is not yet confident with. Please come and see us if you have any concerns or questions.

Name Writing

We have also been very busy in school practising our name writing skills with our wonderful new name cards. The children all wanted to take them home so we have printed an extra copy and popped them in your child's book bag so you can practise writing their name at home too. We know the children are very excited to show you their special card!

PE Reminder

This week we have had our first PE session in the hall with Mr Mayling. The children absolutely loved being active and learnt how to use such a large space safely, including making sure they listened carefully for the instructions given. They practised finding spaces and moved in a range of ways to these spaces. They galloped, hopped, jumped, jogged, skipped and even moved sideways like a crab!

Please ensure your child comes to school every Wednesday wearing their PE kit. This includes dark coloured jogging bottoms, trainers/plimsolls, a PE t-shirt and their school jumper. This ensures your child can move easily and comfortably in our PE sessions.

I know the children are super excited for some more PE next week!

Look at our pastel firework pictures. We thought carefully about making them bright and colourful. We also looked at the different lines and shapes we could see!




Crackle!
