Orchard Shop Success


This week the Orchard Shop has made a tremendous £128.37 and a big thank you to the 'shopkeeper' children and to all that have purchased from the shop.

History of the Purple Bus 'The Nest' from a Special Visitor with a Close Connection to Our Bus

The bus is a Leyland National built in 1980 for London Transport who used it on their 'Red Arrow' services in central London, mainly linking the central area with Waterloo and Victoria Stations. It was actually the very first of the 'Mark 2' version of the model supplied to London.

In early 1994, it underwent what was known as the Greenway conversion project – basically undergoing a major rebuild to update it and get another good few years' life out of it. This involved the fitting of new panels together with front and rear ends, windscreen and windows, doors, heating and ventilation systems, engine, gearbox, exhaust system, radiator and cooling system, and an interior which complied with the Disabled Persons Transport regulations of the time. This explains why if you Google the registration, you will see it has a different appearance in pictures taken prior to the rebuild.

Later that year, London Transport Buses was split up into different operating companies which were then sold off, effectively privatising the operations which were then competitively contracted to operate routes of behalf of London Transport. GUW438W thus became owned by London General, which is the company I worked for. Having been replaced by newer vehicles, the last job this batch of buses did for London General was a contract to operate the park 'n' ride service at Farnborough Air Show in June 2002 – where I was the last person to drive it as a London bus!

After that, it was sold off to a company called Mass Transit in Lincoln, and then in 2005 onto a Surestart scheme in the Doncaster area, before you acquired it.


