Fun Facts

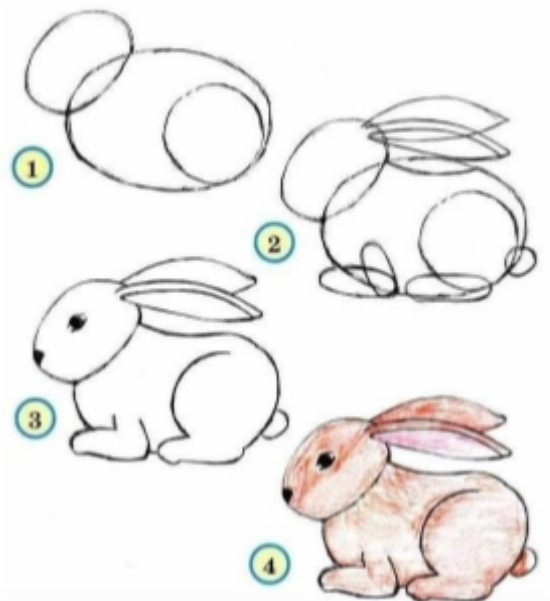
Butterflies taste with their feet! They can't eat or chew so they use a tube like tongue (a bit like a straw) called a proboscis.

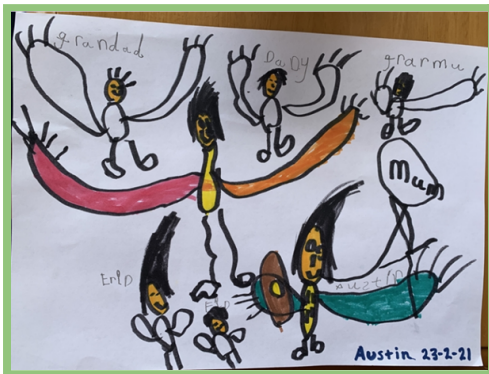

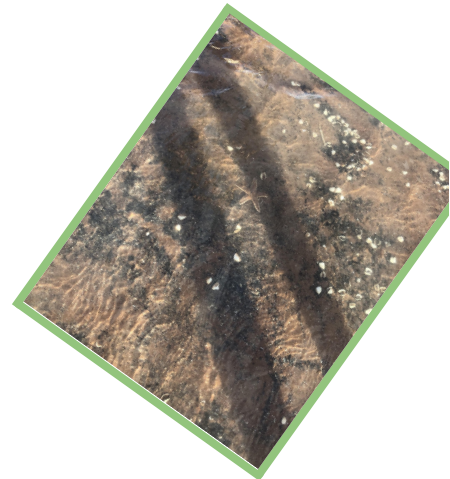
