Extreme Hot Weather

Children cannot control their body temperature as well as adults during hot weather. Children do not sweat as much so may be at risk of ill-health from heat. Do be on the lookout for symptoms of heat exhaustion: tiredness, dizziness, headache, nausea, vomiting, confusion, excessive sweating and pale clammy skin.

We have made plans in school to adapt to the hot weather in case it continues and gets hotter over the coming weeks. This includes an adultled wet zone where children can get a cool spray of water, more canopies around school, a dedicated air-con cold room for full chilling if needed, extra ice-packs, emergency sun cream if needed and... best of all, every Friday at 1.00pm will be ice-pop Friday, when your child can find some shade and relax with an ice-pop.

How you can help from home:

- Please apply sun cream in the morning and send your child in with spare cream. Teachers will then remind children to re-apply before going out to lunch. (Please label the sun cream with your child's name)
- Dressing your children in loose, light clothing. Please feel free to adapt your child's uniform to suit the weather each day e.g. you may want to send them in a long-sleeved cotton top to protect their arms



- Please send them in with a full water bottle. Staff will encourage them to drink plenty during the day and refill their bottle regularly.
- Please send them in with a hat with a wide brim (Please ensure your child's name is written in the hat)





Please ensure school lunches are ordered in advance via the school gateway.



Reminder to make sure all sessions for breakfast and after school club are booked via the school gateway.
