

<p align="center"><u>Maths</u></p> <p>We will begin by developing our understanding of place value and then move onto the written methods for addition and subtraction. In the second half of the Autumn term, we will move into written methods for multiplication and division. Times tables and related division facts will be a constant focus throughout the term.</p>	<p align="center"><u>English</u></p> <p>Our reading for pleasure books will be 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne and 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes. After half term we will be reading 'Blue John' and 'Ug Boy Genius of the Stone Age'. We will be using 'accelerated reader' for developing specific reading skills. In writing, we are beginning with narrative and the children will be writing stories based on 'the true story of the three little pigs'. They will then be writing a time travel story set in the Stone Age. After half term, the children will be writing a leaflet about Skara Brae and we will finish with a narrative story based on the book 'Star in the Jar'.</p>	<p align="center"><u>Science</u></p> <p>In science this term we will be exploring and investigating light and sound. We will be looking at reflection, shadow and how sound travels. These sessions will help develop skills and knowledge, primarily through a variety of practical activities.</p>	<p align="center"><u>History</u></p> <p>Our history unit will be investigating changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. We will also be investigating famous landmarks such as Skara Brae and Stonehenge. These sessions will be taught 'enquiry style' where the children have a variety of activities, mostly adult led, to choose from and the opportunity to mix between classes. We will be making a link to our local area with a year group trip to Kents Cavern. More about this soon!</p>
<p align="center"><u>PE</u></p> <p>Our key outdoor sports will be tag rugby and handball, as we develop the skills of hand-eye coordination and improve our motor skills. Our indoor sports will focus on gymnastics as we develop our skills of agility and flexibility.</p>	<p align="center"><u>Year 3 Autumn Term Curriculum Overview</u></p> <p>In Autumn term, we will recap on key skills from Year 2 and then build skills and knowledge progressively throughout the year. Some subjects will be taught discretely and some will be linked with our science or history. See the attached collectables for more details about our main themes. Please note- plans may change according to the class' needs.</p>		<p align="center"><u>French</u></p> <p>This is a new subject in key stage two and so we will begin by learning the skills of basic communication including greetings and asking how someone is feeling. We will also be learning simple classroom commands and studying other countries where French is spoken. Additionally we will also learn numbers 1-6.</p>
<p align="center"><u>RE</u></p> <p>This term we will be learning about what Christians believe about the creation story. We will also be looking at Jewish festivals and family life.</p>	<p align="center"><u>PSHCE</u></p> <p>Our Jigsaw themes are 'Being Me in My World' and 'Celebrating Difference'. We will also be developing our skills as independent learners as we return to school and the children enter a new key stage.</p>	<p align="center"><u>ART</u></p> <p>We will be investigating block printing which will be linked to cave art and we will begin to master printing techniques. We will be looking specifically at work by Ruth Thomas.</p>	<p align="center"><u>Computing</u></p> <p>An ongoing part of our digital curriculum is SMART online safety. The children will also develop typing skills throughout the year. Our computing unit this term is based around digital devices and networks.</p>
