

Sara Pike

As I'm sure you are all aware, very sadly, Mrs Pike is retiring.

Sara has been at St Margaret's for 12 years. During this time, she has been the inspirational heart in our relational attachment-aware approach to all that we do. Never blowing her own trumpet and always working humbly and with absolute dedication, it has been her leadership that has helped create the special school we have today. Because of Sara, relationships are at the heart of everything we do. It is our number one word that describes St Margaret's. It is probably our Unique Selling Point.

Nowadays, schools are gradually coming round to the need to have a relational, rather than punishment model. There is a recognition that punishment doesn't work. Sara has been years ahead of this and because of her, so has St Margaret's. Sara led us in gaining recognition from Oxford University for our attachment and trauma-informed practice, and recognition from Leeds Beckett University with our Mental Health Award.

Despite her self-effacing nature, other professionals well know the true value of her knowledge, learning and expertise. Her practice is recognised across the Bay and examples of her work are used as models for training safeguarding leaders and SENCOs. When we had our inspection in June 2023, it was good to see that Ofsted also recognised this. At the requests of other schools and practitioners, she has shared her learning and journey, always in a typically understated manner with a keenness to celebrate the achievements of others, rather than herself, and always wanting to learn more herself.

To best describe Sara's legacy however, is better to mention the individual children and families. If you have been lucky enough to know Sara, you will know exactly what I mean. She has been the ultimate advocate for every child and family she has ever worked with, taking to heart all their worries and striving to apply all her learning and experience to help improve their lives.

Sara has completed an extensive handover of her Deputy Head Teacher and safeguarding roles to Nicole Turner who now has a massive file titled, "Sara's Brain". Sara has also spent this year working closely with Sophie Essam who, in the exact same mindset as Sara, is leading our SENCO provision and joining our Senior Leadership Team. Also, we are very thankful to Sara as she will be joining us as one of our trustees from September to bring that knowledgeable support and challenge which will be invaluable to us.

On a personal level, I would like to thank Sara for supporting me in my Head Teacher role. Her kind wisdom, knowledgeable insight and generous support have been invaluable. I will miss her hugely.

Finally, I would like to thank Sara on behalf of the whole school community and the broader educational world. I know we all wish her a richly-deserved, happy and healthy retirement adventure.
