


Once at the cinema, the children will enjoy a complimentary movie and popcorn. If you would prefer your child not to have popcorn, please inform the school office or your child's class teacher.

- **Safeguarding:** If your concern relates to safeguarding, email the school office and request contact with our Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL), Mrs Turner.

Specialist Staff: If you need to speak to a senior leader or specialist (e.g., SEND, Pastoral or Senior Leader), please indicate this in your email or phone call so we can direct you to the right person.

We will continue to use school communication texts and emails for important, last-minute reminders about events such as class assemblies or parent-teacher meetings.

- **Events:** We look forward to seeing you at parent-teacher meetings and other school events throughout the year.






