New Golden Mile Running Track and Outdoor Fitness Equipment

The new Golden Mile (GM) Running Track and Outdoor Fitness Equipment has been installed and it occupies a prominent position on our school field and it also blends in with the outdoor space too.

The prevalence of obesity among children in Torbay has increased sharply in recent years. At St Margaret's we believe that it's important to make certain that the all children are given the opportunity to participate in as many outdoor activities as possible as a way of dealing with obesity. Studies have shown that a third of children are overweight or obese by the time they leave school. We are really lucky at St Margaret's to have an all weather running track on our school field. This means during the school day the children get to have a brain break by running a few laps. The children also get to run around the track at Mr Tullier's GM running club. We record this on the Golden Mile website which records how many miles they have done and they can receive awards and medals for their efforts. The plan is to improve fitness levels, cognitive behaviour and wellbeing of all the children in school.

Our stunning running track is 161m long (10 laps = 1 mile) and is constructed using a bound rubber chip, which is very safe and comfortable surface to run on. To make it even more fun and interesting for the children, 3 pieces of outdoor fitness equipment have been installed next to the track. The children can use these to develop their fitness, strength and balance.



How was it funded? The majority of the funding came from the PE and Sport Premium, with additional support coming from the GM fundraiser and Tesco Ground Works community fund. We thank the children so much again for taking part in the fun run and raising lots of money. Also, we thank Mrs Scaife for her hard work securing the grant from Tesco. We really appreciate your support in helping our school raise lots of money for the Golden Mile track and the track will create a lasting legacy at St Margaret's, facilitating an active lifestyle for all children. Thank you, from Mr Mayling.
