
# **Design Technology Homework Project**

Once a term we have a homework project competition based on a different subject, judged by our friends from Dunboyne Court, the nearby retirement home. This term, it's Design Technology. Judging will take place on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March in school. The winners will have lunch with our friends from Dunboyne and will take their projects to Dunboyne to share with the less-mobile residents.

Three children from Year 6 have designed a poster to advertise the event and give children some ideas. It is very open-ended and we hope to inspire children to be excited about their learning to make something that really interests them. We have given children ideas based around three main areas: structures, textiles and moving mechanisms, and asking them to think about the design cycle (research – design – make – evaluate).
