Art Skills and Techniques

 Experiment with different ways to apply paint – with glue spreaders, flicking, splattering, blots, dribbles (pouring)

- Create blocks of flat colour.
- Study complimentary colours on the colour wheel.
- Apply other media to a dry painting (ink, crayon, oil pastels)

abstract	Art that looks as if it contains little or no recognisable or realistic forms from the physical world. Focus is on formal elements such as colours, lines or shapes.
blend	To merge colours on a piece of paper or canvas. A type of shading.
Dab	strike with a light blow
Dot	mark with a small spot or spots.
Flat	smooth and even
Imaginary	existing only in the imagination.
Intense	of extreme force or strength.
Layer	arrange in a layer or layers.
Modern	relating to the present or recent times

Opaque	not able to be seen through; not transparent.
